






In terms of population growth, Switzerland is a dynamic country



Births and fertility





Deaths and mortality


The fight against infectious diseases, the general improvement in living conditions and the development of medical techniques reduced mortality over the course of the 20th century





Divorces and dissolved partnerships





Foreign nationals arriving in or leaving Switzerland mainly come from Europe



Ageing


There are ever fewer young people and ever more older people dependent on the working-age population



The percentage of older people grows each year




Population projections
