




### In terms of population growth, Switzerland is a dynamic country




### In 2023, Switzerland had almost 9 million inhabitants compared with 6.8 million in 1990




#### Births and fertility

### Each successive generation is smaller than that of its parents




### In 2023, more than one birth in four took place outside marriage




#### Deaths and mortality

The overall upward trend in the number of deaths is linked to demographic ageing in a growing population. The increase is particularly pronounced in the group of 80-year-olds and over.


### Between 2022 and 2023, more than 1700 same-sex couples tied the knot

A record number of divorces was registered in 2010 with 22 100 legal dissolutions of marriages



### Foreign nationals arriving in or leaving Switzerland mainly come from Europe








Life expectancy at birth in Switzerland has doubled since the end of the 19th century. In 2023, it was 82.2 years for men and 85.8 years for women. Life expectancy for women is still higher, although the difference is gradually decreasing.




#### The percentage of older people grows each year




### Population projections
