
Poverty rate according to various characteristics, 2014



The poverty rate is based on income and does not take into account any financial assets. The household variables are based on persons who live in households with these characteristics. The variables relating to the educational and labour market are only collected for persons aged 18 or over. All persons under the age of 18 and economically inactive persons aged 18–24 who live with their father and/or mother are considered to be children. Employed persons are defined here as persons aged 18 or over who were self-employed or employed for more than half of the months in the year before the survey (most frequent activity status). Only subgroups with at least 200 observations in the sample and a confidence interval of a maximum of ±10% are shown.

The confidence interval is used to determine whether the observed differences between two values are statistically significant. Example: The poverty rate of men was $5.7\% (\pm 0.6)$, that of women $7.6\% (\pm 0.7)$. The confidence intervals of these two groups were 5.1% to 6.3% and 6.9% to 8.3% and do not overlap. The difference observed is therefore statistically significant.
