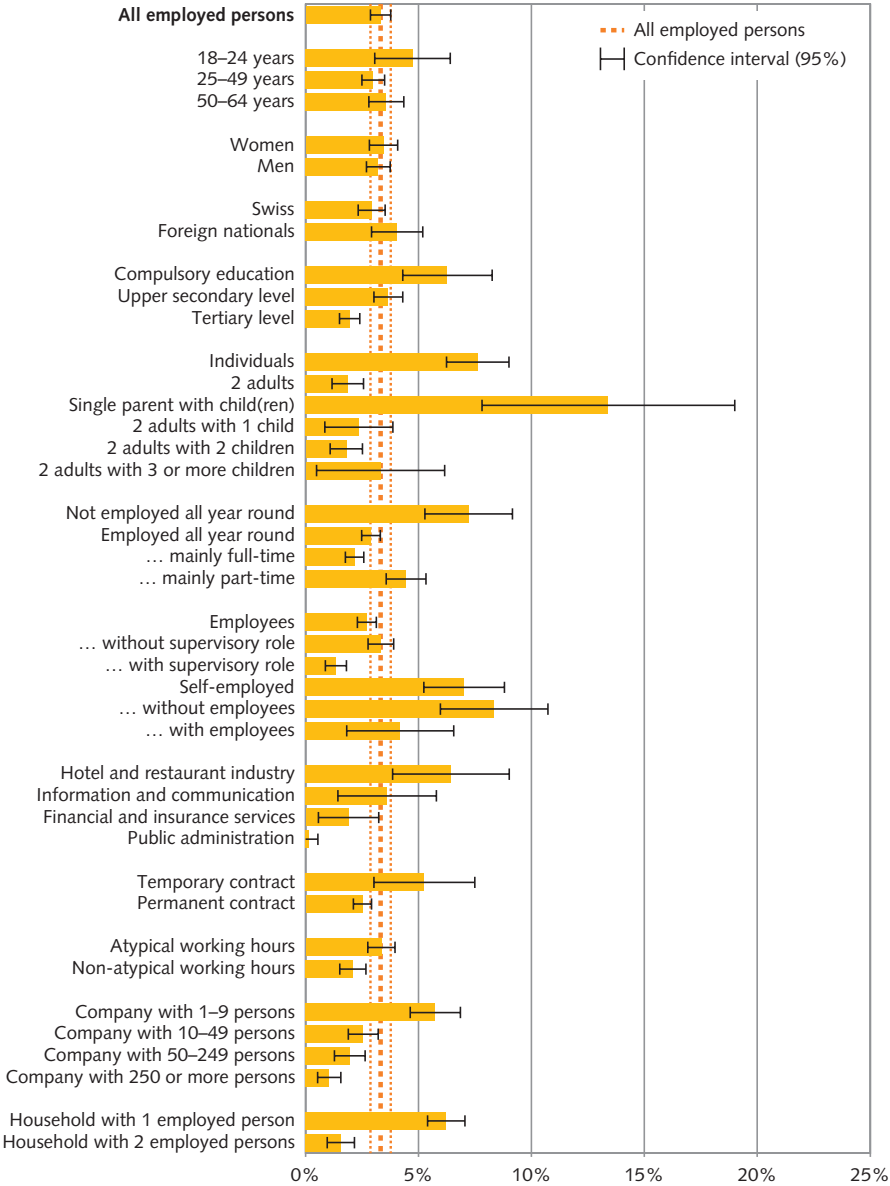


Poverty rates among employed persons according to various characteristics, 2014



The household variables concern people living in households with these characteristics. Employed persons are defined here as persons aged 18 or over who were self-employed or employed for more than half of the months in the year before the survey (most frequent activity status). Atypical working hours include working at night and at the weekend, as well as variable working hours imposed by others. Only subgroups with at least 200 observations in the sample and a confidence interval of a maximum of $\pm 10\%$ are shown. The confidence interval is used to determine whether the observed differences between two values are statistically significant. Example: The poverty rate of employees was 2.7% (± 0.4), that of the self-employed 7.0% (± 1.8). The confidence intervals of these two groups were 2.3% to 3.1% and 5.2% to 8.8% and do not overlap. The difference observed is therefore statistically significant.
