Swiss Confederation

The formal framework

Art. 65 of the Federal Constitution

- 1 The Confederation shall compile the necessary statistical data on the status and trends in the population, the economy, society, education, research, the land and the environment in Switzerland.
- 2 It may issue regulations on the harmonisation and maintenance of official registers in order to reduce the cost of compiling data.

Federal Statistics Act (FStatA) of 9 October 1992

Art. 3 Duties of the federal statistical bodies

1 Federal statistical bodies prepare representative results in a professionally independent way on the status of and changes in the population, the economy, society, spatial planning and the environment in Switzerland.

Art. 18 Dissemination

1 The relevant statistical results and principles are published in user-friendly form in the official languages. Results that are not published are made accessible in an appropriate manner.


