



Staff of higher education institutions (SHIS-PERS)

Description

The Swiss Higher Education Information System's staff database (SHIS-PERS) was created to meet a growing need for coordination and planning by the Confederation and the cantons in the university sector. The staff statistics for the three types of higher education institution (universities incl. federal institutes of technology UIT, universities of applied sciences UAS, universities of teacher education UTE) are derived from three separate surveys. They are published annually and provide information on the human resources available in the Swiss tertiary education sector.

With the help of a series of differentiation criteria, comparisons of the use of resources can be made between the respective institutions, between fields of study, staff categories and between different types of activities. Furthermore, the socio-demographic characteristics of staff serve as a foundation for addressing key policy issues in higher education, including gender equality.

The collected data provides an essential foundation for calculating indicators used in national and international comparative studies. It is also used as a basis for determining reference costs for university funding allocation.

The statistical surveys were partially revised and harmonised in 2013. New SHIS staff categories were introduced that apply to all types of higher education institutions. In addition, the full-time equivalents for all types of higher education institutions are now based on the calendar year, while the number of staff relate to a reference date (31.12).

Variables

Higher education staff are all persons who were employed at a Swiss university during a calendar year (reference year).

Quality of statistical data

While the quality of the administrative data is high, it is always a challenge to accurately determine the amount of work time spent on the separate activities in reality; these data should therefore be understood as approximate values.

Most recent evaluation of quality: 2014, continuous improvement in cooperation with university representatives (coordinating committees for university staff statistics UIT/UAS/UTE)

Policy on revisions

Periodic revisions

The currently published figures for earlier years may differ from previously published figures, as the data is retrospectively corrected if necessary. Each calculation reflects the latest information available.

Methodical / ad hoc revisions

Revisions are undertaken as required (e.g. nomenclature updates).
