Swiss Labour Force Survey

Description	Conducted for the first time in 1991, the Swiss Labour Force Survey (SLFS) is sent out to individuals every year. The main purpose of the SLFS is to provide information on the structure of the labour force and employment behaviour patterns. Strict adherence to international definitions allows Swiss data to be compared with OECD and EU data. Since 2010, the SLFS is conducted on a continuous basis.

	Statistical basis and survey units: Permanent resident population aged 15 and older

Methodology	Survey based on sampling of individuals. The SLFS is a telephone survey based on a sample of some 105,000 interviews (approx. 35,000 from 2002 to 2009 and approx. 16,000 until 2001). The addresses are selected at random from the FSO's sample register. This is mainly based of official records of the inhabitants of the municipalities and cantons. Since 2003, an additional sampling of foreigners (15,000 until 2009 and 21,000 from 2010) was selected from the central information system on migration (ZEMIS). From the 2nd quarter of 2014, this subsample is also selected from the FSO's sample register. In total, 126'000 interviews are conducted. The persons who participate in the survey are interviewed 4 times over a period of one and a half year.
